## Minnesota man breaks snowmobile record in Ironwood

IRONWOOD — Nick Keller, of Richmond, Minn., accomplished his goal of breaking the world record for the longest snowmobile journey in 60 days Wednesday morning when he clocked 12,789 miles in Ironwood.

It only took Keller 40 days to break the record.

Keller isn't stopping at 12,789 miles.

"I've got 20 more days to ride," he said Wednesday, as he set out to expand on his mileage record.

Keller has until Feb. 23 to complete his 60 days of riding the trails on the Gogebic Range and in Iron County, Wis.
