Minnesota man taking run at record to raise cancer awareness

IRONWOOD — Nick Keller from Richmond, Minn., will attempt to break the current "longest snowmobile journey" world record when he sets out on a 12,200-mile trek

from his home on Dec. 26.

The current record of 12,163 miles in 60 consecutive days is held by Robert Davis from Maine. Davis set the record in 2008 while snowmobiling in Maine and Canada.

Keller is riding for cancer.

The home base for much of Keller's 60-day trek will be out of his second home in Ironwood.

Termed "Snowball Cancer," the event is
